

Pet New Year's Resolutions (including Dogs)

- **1. Play More:** Playing is not only good exercise for both of you but a great way to bond with your pet. Although each individual pet may not enjoy the same type of play, find what works best for your pet.
- 2. Measure their Food for Each Meal: This one may not be straight out of their mouths, but will be very useful in helping to maintain their "beach body" figures throughout the year (wouldn't dieting be easier if someone fed you?). This method will also alert you faster if a there is a change in their appetite, which may be an indicator of a health issue.
- 3. Try a New Activity: This doesn't need to be complicated, like teaching your dog a Salsa routine! This can be as simple as trying a dog park, or teaching your cat to walk on a leash. Pets are never too old to learn something new, so teach them a new trick to show off to your friends.
- **4. Share Their Love:** If you have a well-adjusted, laid back, but social pet, take them out to visit people that could use some extra companionship. Seniors in assisted living love having pets visit them, or some schools and libraries have programs where children gain confidence by reading to pets.
 - **5. Make a Doctor's Appointment:** Make sure your pet has been in to see the vet for their annual examination. Although this may not be their favorite resolution, it will help keep them healthy and happy for many years to come. This, also, gives you an opportunity to discuss any age-related or behavioral changes, and a chance to catch any health issues before they become a bigger problem.

- **6. Spa Day Bonding:** Grooming your pet is a soothing bonding activity, if positively introduced to them. If your grooming has gotten a bit behind, have them start with a professional first. Brush your pet frequently, to help keep their coat fresh and untangled. Slowly introduce tooth brushing to keep their teeth healthy and their breath kissable fresh.
 - **7. ID Checks:** Make sure your pet is wearing their most current ID tag or rabies tag. If your pet is microchipped, verify that your information or your emergency contact's information hasn't changed.
- **8. Take a Ride:** For many pets, the only time they are in the car is to go to the veterinarian. Take them somewhere fun, or at least a drive around town. Starting off with really short rides, and slowly increasing as they become comfortable. If they don't get car sick, give them some treats!
- **9. Start an Emergency Fund:** Just like people, pets can develop health issues or have an accident that needs medical attention quickly. More and more people are starting to get pet insurance to help with these types of situations as well.
- **10. Fix a Bad Habit**: Decide on one issue you want to be resolved this year and stay dedicated to fixing it. This can be anything from your cat eating out of your cereal bowl to your dog tackling strangers as they walk in the door. Remember, you can ask your veterinarian about suggestions to help with these issues, and there are trainers and behaviorists available for back up.



Cat NAPS 2016 Statistics!


- > 116 Cats and Kittens found their forever homes!
